Rwanda

In Rwanda, you'll be amazed by breathtaking scenery, a sparkling clean city, and forward thinking vision. You will savor fabulous culinary creations with delicious local ingredients and rest at night in the world famous Heaven Hotel.

Rwanda is a one-of-a-kind country, having overcome unthinkable violence, devastation and division to now being recognized as one of the safest and fastest developing countries in the world. Kigali is a remarkable destination with its beautiful hilly setting, clean streets, diverse dining options, and gracious people. Rwanda is also a teacher. Rwandans have come together to heal from the trauma of the past, engaging in reconciliation and practicing forgiveness for the sake of a better future.

In respect for the history of Rwanda and with an intent to learn from the history of this country we will make time to visit the Kigali Genocide Memorial. African Road Changemaker partner Philbert Kalisa of REACH, will help us grasp what the country has overcome as we will learn from genocide survivors and perpetrators who, guided by Philbert's work, have been through a remarkable process of healing and reconciliation together. There is much

we can learn from them. REACH is now moving to create community-based mental health supports to address mental health issues stemming from the history of trauma.

Time and experience at The Community of Togetherness with Changemakers Steven Turikunkiko and Peninah Mukashema is a centerpiece of this trip. Steven was the first Changemaker partner and the inspiration for the formation of African Road.

The Community of Togetherness serves hundreds of girls, boys, women and men in the rural area of Mulindi, Ndera Sector. You can anticipate and witness (and perhaps join in) incredible cultural dancing and drumming from Togetherness' own troupe and warm welcomes for everyone. You will witness social change taking place on the soccer field with the young people of Togetherness, push up your sleeves and learn from the women of Togetherness bakery, experience the joy of kids learning in a wonderful preschool and primary school.

Sports, beauty, joy, healing, inspiring leaders, dance, arts, innovative savings groups and small businesses, community-led development and genuine partnership are all hallmarks of this travel experience.

Tanzania

Dar es Salaam is a bustling port city, sitting on the turquoise Indian Ocean. Industrious and multicultural with sights, sounds and flavors from across Africa, the Middle East, India and beyond. Warm and welcoming, a shining example of diversity and coexistence. Most importantly for our team, it is the home of the incredible New Hope for Girls Family, and Changemakers Consoler and Eliya Wilbert and the 60 plus girls in their healing care.

Consoler leads as a devoted mama and a brilliant doctor (Phd), as a trauma survivor and a joyful spirit, as a courageous person living with a disability and a deeply wise soul. Her kind husband Eliya is a loving dad to the girls in their care and a phenomenal facilitator of the VICOBA Plus process.

New Hope for Girls, is a unique model for a family based program for fostering, with healing, hope, love and strong community. The 60 plus girls who make up the New Hope for Girls family (along with the Wilberts own biological daughter and son)

have been rescued from treacherous circumstances and are loved, educated and empowered. You can feel the genuine joy that carries this full household forward. Learn how healing is possible in the most difficult circumstances and what genuine empowerment of girls and women can look like. Also, learn and see how African Road partners with New Hope for Girls to equip them toward sustainability. A highlight will be spending a day with the New Hope family playing, preparing food, dancing and celebrating together. We are excited to also visit the New Hope for Girls Forever Home construction site. Get ready for a story worth sharing!

Dar es Salaam is also home to the very inspiring Elimika VICOBA Plus women's cooperative. These vibrant and entrepreneurial women will share how VICOBA Plus mindset change, savings, innovation and strong community has changed their lives. We will visit small businesses, hear stories of creative enterprise and share joy- and surely, dance together.

7/7 Tuesday

The adventure begins! Flight departures from the USA.

7/8 Wednesday

MORNING - Arrival at Amsterdam Schiphol airport arrival and team rendezvous.

EVENING - Arrive in Kigali, Rwanda. Process our visa on arrival - all you need is your passport, your visa is pre-paid - and then collect our luggage. We will be greeted at the airport by Rwandan friends. Drive to the lovely Heaven Boutique Hotel in Kigali with check-in likely close to 9pm. You can look forward to a pleasing, safe and welcoming accommodation in a beautiful boutique compound, right next door to the famous Heaven Restaurant and Bar. Pool, Spa and Gym onsite. You'll have your own room (single or double as requested) with a private bath, air conditioning and tasteful aesthetic.

7/9 Thursday

MORNING - Enjoy local tea and coffee with your own french press and electric kettle in your room. Breakfast, coffee and tea are available from early morning onward. Gather for Initial introductions and instructions, and team orientation activities.

AFTERNOON

Lunch at Milles Des Collines (Hotel Rwanda site) to hear Steven Turikunkiko's story (founder of Togetherness) and meet President Peninah.

After lunch, travel to the Community of Togetherness for an introductory walking tour. Hear and then see the history of Togetherness, a remarkable community formed of 80 kids who were orphaned by the 1994 Genocide Against the Tutsi in Rwanda. The determination and vision of the young Steven Turikunkiko, helped people suffering trauma and left without family or resources, to be better off together than alone. Steven was African Road's inspiration for forming. Step by step, African Road has walked with the The Community of Togetherness as they have built a better future themselves. Today this community is a group of leaders who are serving their neighbors with what they have. Learn about effective community-led development and be inspired.

Breakfast meeting and preparation for Visiting the Genocide Memorial Centre in Kigali. This compelling memorial and museum, walks visitors through the historical setting and events that led to the 1994 Genocide Against the Tutsi in Rwanda. The Memorial Gardens are an internment site for over 250,000 people whose lives were taken. This important experience helps to frame the Rwandan story of recovery and healing. Visiting the memorial is an act of respect to the people we are spending time with and is instructive. Make a trip to the Gisozi Genocide Memorial and learn from the history of Rwanda.

African Road friend, Changemaker Philbert began to work with genocide perpetrators and survivors in 1995. He brought people together through an incredible process, working to forge healing, forgiveness and reconciliation. REACH has helped many of these people then continue to live out daily life in peace together, through the formation of Unity Groups. African Road partners with REACH to bring and expand VICOBA Plus as a tool for furthering togetherness and providing tools and training to equip these group members to innovate, dream big and flourish financially.

The team will have a special and unforgettable opportunity to hear testimony from a perpetrator and a survivor who are now friends and who teach others how forgiveness and reconciliation are possible in the most difficult of situations.

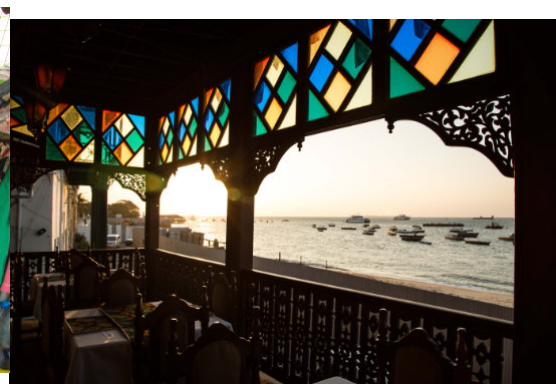
